

Third Sunday of Easter

In the Gospel we find the Apostles gathered behind closed doors, wounded in heart and spirit. But Jesus appears to them, gives them his peace and breathes new life into them. He does the same for us.

Theme of the Weekend Readings: We gather to worship God and to celebrate again Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

First Reading: The death of Jesus was in accordance with God's plan.

Second Reading: Jesus is the one who overcomes sin and failure.

Gospel: Jesus appears to the Apostles and confirms their faith.

Public Masses: Following on from **Taoiseach Micheal Martin's** address on 30th March 2021, places of Worship would remain closed except for private prayer, weddings and funerals. Attendance at weddings will be limited to 6 people and funerals will be limited to 10 people. **As and from the 26th April**, attendance at funerals will be raised to 25 people.

Fr. Dan will celebrate Mass on Saturday 24th April at 7pm and again on Sunday 25th April at 11am. Mass will also be celebrated on Wednesday 21st April at 10.00am and Friday 23rd April at 10.00am. All Masses will be streamed live through our webcam on www.rosberconparish.ie
