Following on from Taoiseach Micheal Martin's address on 30th April 2021, Public Masses have now resumed in Rosbercon Church. It is very good news that we are now able to pray together and celebrate Mass and the Sacrament of Baptism. Because of a Government Directive we are not in a position to decide the dates of Confirmation or First Holy Communion.

Public Masses have resumed in Rosbercon and Listerlin Churches. For the month of May there will be Mass each Saturday evening in Rosbercon at 7.00pm and on Sundays Mass will be celebrated in Listerlin/Mullinarrigle at 9.30am and in Rosbercon at 11.00am. From the month of June onwards the Saturday evening programme will be as follows: On the first Saturday of each month Mass will be celebrated in Tullogher at 7.00pm. On the second and fourth Saturdays of the month Mass will be celebrated in Rosbercon at 7.00pm. On the third and fifth Saturdays of the month there will be **no** Saturday evening Mass. Every Sunday of the year Mass will be celebrated in Listerlin/ Mullinarrigle at 9.30am and in Rosbercon at 11.00am. Daily Mass is celebrated in Rosbercon Church on Wednesday & Friday at 10am:

What is the capacity of the Churches of the Parish? Because of the two-meter social distancing regulation, the calculated capacity of the Churches is as follows: Rosbercon: 72, (using the side aisles as separate pods) Listerlin: 72 (two galleries) Tullogher: 50.

Entering the Church: Enter the Church through the main door only. Leave the Church by the side doors and main door. Be aware of the need to keep social distancing outside the Church after Mass.

Holy Communion: People come to Communion in single file maintaining the two-metre distance. Communion will be dropped in the hand of those receiving, without hands touching. Communion will be taken in the hand only.

Church Collections: Collection Boxes will be left at the doors of the Church for your offerings.

A Message from Fr Dan: Pentecost: The Coming of the Spirit: This weekend's celebration of Pentecost is a beautiful feast. Scripture tells us that over two thousand years ago the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, accompanied by miraculous signs of mighty winds and tongues of fire. The descent of the Spirit is the final act of our salvation which God had promised. From Old Testament times there was an expectation that God would sent his Spirit to his people. So, the coming of the Holy Spirit reminds us that God fulfils his promises, even if it takes time!!

The sound of the wind and the flame that accompanies the Spirit represent the creative breath of God and fire was also associated with the purifying presence of God. The wind and the fire tell us that God is about to do something 'new' or even that God is creating something new. The experience of the Spirit this weekend changes what is old and stale within us to something new.

Why does God send the Holy Spirit to us? God sent the Holy Spirit to his followers because the early Church needed God's Spirit. The first disciples were in hiding after their experience of the crucifixion of Jesus. They were terrified that what had happened to Jesus would happen to them. Only the power of the Holy Spirit would get them over their fear.

In answer to their prayer, God sent the Holy Spirit, to embolden them to go out and preach the story of Jesus and to remind the people of the love of God. Pentecost reminds us that God will fulfil his promises, even if it takes time. His presence this weekend is powerful and re-creates the old into something new as he responds to our needs today. So, let us all pray, *Veni Sancte Spiritus*, Come Holy Spirit.
