## The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: Corpus Christi

This is the feast of Corpus Christi – the Body of Christ. St. Paul continually reminds us that we are the Body of Christ. When we gather here the Body of Christ becomes visible. As we prepare to celebrate the Eucharist, we call to mind how important it is that we should be reconciled with one another.

A Message from Fr Dan: This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ: When Jesus was about to leave the world to return to his Father, he assured his followers, and us, that he would never leave us. Jesus instituted the Eucharist so that he would continue to be with us. He asked that we Do this in Memory of Me: In this way, Jesus is present at every Mass. He is very close to us.

At Mass, Jesus gives himself to us, as he did during his lifetime. We remember the story how Jesus, at the end of a tiring day, would not send his followers away hungry He fed his people with five barley loaves and two fish. Jesus took the loaves and the fish, blessed, broke and gave them to the apostles to distribute to the people. In the hands of the apostles the bread kept on increasing.

The lesson that Jesus wants us to learn is that he constantly nourishes us with the bread of Life in the Mass. In today's gospel story, Jesus repeats his act of giving when on Holy Thursday night, He took the bread, blessed, broke it and gave it to his disciples saying "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in memory of me". These words mean that at each Mass, Jesus changes the bread and wine into his Body and Blood.

Every Sunday we gather as a community to celebrate Mass together. We listen to God's word, we pray and are nourished in Holy Communion. Jesus wants us to continue living the Eucharist in our daily lives. In our giving to others, in our respect, through acts of kindness, generosity, and goodness we live the love of Jesus. It is our presence at Mass that strengthens us to prayer and to serve. That is what Jesus asks us to do when we are sent forth at the end of Mass.

**Public Masses** have resumed in Rosbercon and Listerlin Churches. From the month of June onwards the Saturday evening programme of Masses will be as follows: On the first Saturday of each month Mass will be celebrated in Tullogher at 7:00 pm. On the second and fourth Saturdays of the month Mass will be celebrated in Rosbercon at 7:00 pm. On the third and fifth Saturdays of the month there will be **no** Saturday evening Mass. Every Sunday of the year Mass will be celebrated in Listerlin/Mullinarrigle at 9:30 am and in Rosbercon at 11:00 am. Daily Mass is celebrated in Rosbercon Church on Wednesday & Friday at 10:00 am:

What is the capacity of the Churches of the Parish? Because of the two-meter social distancing regulation, the calculated capacity of the Churches is as follows: Rosbercon: 72, (using the side aisles as separate pods) Listerlin: 72 (two galleries) Tullogher: 50.

**Entering the Church:** Enter the Church through the main door only. Leave the Church by the side doors and main door. Be aware of the need to keep social distancing outside the Church after Mass.

**Holy Communion:** People come to Communion in single file maintaining the two-metre distance. Communion will be dropped in the hand of those receiving, without hands touching. Communion will be taken in the hand only.

**Church Collections:** Collection Boxes will be left at the doors of the Church for your offerings.
