**Getting married in the Catholic Church –what is needed?** The couple must first contact their local Parish Priest where they live and book the Church where they wish to marry. They must ensure they have a priest to perform the ceremony. A Pre-Nuptial Enquiry Form must be completed for each person by the priest. For this the following are required: Baptismal Certificate, Confirmation Certificate and Proof of Freedom to Marry. The couple will be required to complete a Marriage Preparation Course. It is always best to check with your priest regarding local regulations and practices in the Parish and Diocese.
