♦ ST. MOLING'S ROSBERCON TULLOGHER CHAPTER, ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Since December we have experienced a substantial increase in requests for food, school expenses and heating requirements. We expect such requests to continue throughout the coming winter months which will put us under financial pressure. Currently, parishioners are our only source of funds. For example we recently had to support a family with three young children, the father, had recently lost his employment through no fault of his own. The mother contacted us for immediate help as they had neither money or food in the house at the time. We immediately provided both food and other necessities until his unemployment benefit arrived which took four weeks to process.

In another case an elderly lady was living on her own and depending solely on her social welfare income. She suffers from considerable ill health which requires constant heat but she can only afford to light a fire a few nights a week due to the cost of coal and timber. This resulted in her having to go to bed early to keep warm. In many such cases St. Vincent De Paul is the only available source of assistance.

In our Parish we will do whatever we can to alleviate such genuine cases and will leave no stone unturned to prevent children in particular from going hungry.
