A Message from Fr. Dan: Hope: Desmond Tutu said, "Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness." You don't get out of bed in the morning without hope. Synod Update: As the recent phase of the Synod drew to a close in Rome this past weekend much focus was on the synthesis document that emerged from the sessions. Many focused on what was in it; others on what was not. Some lamented that the Synod document did not reference many Dogma teachings, and others that it did not address the role of women in our Church and other issues as clearly as it might. Some have commented, rightly, that the actual experience of synod was more important than the document that emerged. Because that experience cannot be "unhad", the Church can never go backwards. Questions are on the table... they have been asked... we now have to continue to journey with them. It was heartening to read that those in attendance could not imagine a future Synod without the involvement of all - that this had to be said is shocking; but that this was said is shockingly wonderful. These conversations will now continue in our local churches and parishes. #### Saint Laurence O'Toole

The Feast of St. Laurence O'Toole is celebrated on the 14<sup>th</sup> November. Laurence was born in Dublin and attended school in Glendalough. As a young boy he was religious and studious. He became Archbishop of Dublin in 1162 and his fame as a holy man spread because of his penitential lifestyle and love of the poor. When the Normans came to Ireland in 1170, he made every effort to defend the rights of his country. He was on his way to make a peace settlement with Henry 11 when he became ill in Normandy and died there. Saint Laurence is the patron saint of the Archdiocese of Dublin. We ask him to intercede for God's blessing on the people of Ireland and in particular for the people of Dublin. Saint Laurence pray for us.
