A Message from Fr Dan - Spring-Time - Lá Féile Bríde:

"We sing a song to Brigid, Brigid brings the Spring,

We celebrate Saint Brigid's Day on Thursday, 1st February, traditionally, the first day of Springtime. We have noticed the lengthening evenings and the increase of light in recent mornings.
