Dan: This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Blessed Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit: "The Glory of God is a human being fully alive". (St. Irenaeus). This is our deepest vocation; to be a good human being and to be a good Christian. We cannot be one without the other. Our deepest calling is to become the people God intended us to be.
